- We eat Matzah on Pesach because:
 - it gives us faith in G-d for a whole year
 - we left Egypt so quickly the dough had no time to rise
 - we were slaves in Egypt
 - all of the above
- The Matzah in Egypt didn't rise (puff up) since;
 - it was too tired
 - nothing dared to rise up before Hashem
 - the Jews left in a hurry so it had no time to rise
- What is *Shmurah Matzah*?
 - A new kind of Matzah ball
 - very old Matzah powder
 - Matzah made from wheat which has been carefully guarded from becoming *chametz* from harvesting to the baking
- What is *Chametz*?
 - flour and water blended for over 18 min. at room temperature
 - the name of a NY baseball team
 - another word for *chutzpah*
 - any kind of leavened grain food
 - radioactive dirt

 - comes from Israel
 - is called *Mayim SheLanu*
 - must remain overnight to cool
 - is blessed by the Rabbi
- Why say *Le'shem Matzat Mitzvah* when baking Matzah?
 - so that we concentrate on the Mitzvah of baking Matzah
 - to tell everyone to work very fast
 - to while the time away
- What do we do with the small piece of dough that we separate from the Matzah dough?
 - eat it right away
 - make a Dreidel with it
 - burn it
 - let it rise and make bread with it
- Why must a Matzah have holes in it?
 - so that you can see through it
 - so that it's "holy" Matzah
 - so that it doesn't get bubbles in it
 - since it's poor bread
- What is the difference between square & round Matzot?
 - round ones are made by hand with the thought to do a Mitzvah
 - square ones are made by machines
 - only the shape
- What kind of foods do we not eat on Pesach?
 - bread, cookies, & cereal
 - whisky, beer and brandy
 - potatoes, onions, and carrots
 - potato latkas
- Before Pesach it is important to sell your:
 - chometz
 - comic books
 - car
 - house
- What do we do the evening before Pesach?
 - pack our luggage
 - search the house for Chametz
 - search for our Lulav
 - light birthday candles
- Why don't we eat Matzah the afternoon before Pesach?
 - we're too busy
 - because it's still hot from the oven
 - so that we will appreciate its taste at the Seder later
- The Haggadah tells the story of:
 - how the Jews left Egypt
 - the hardships of the Jews in Egypt
 - the miracles G-d did for our forefathers
 - all of the above

 - without anyone seeing
- We eat bitter herbs at the Seder because:
 - sweet herbs are for Sukkot
 - Jews like bitter things
 - we remember the bitterness of exile in Egypt
 - they keep us from falling asleep
 - instead of desert
- The *Charoses* on the seder plate reminds us of:
 - the bitter tears of the Jews
 - the cement and the bricks
 - the hard labor the Jews did in Egypt

- The last thing we eat at the Seder is:
 - chicken soup
 - bitter herbs
 - the egg in salt water
 - the *Afikoman* (half of the middle Matzah that is set aside earlier)
