## CHILDREN ACROSS THE TRI-STATE AREA MAKE AND BLOW THEIR OWN HORNS

New York- Teams of master Shofar makers are teaching children across the tri-state area the ancient craft of Shofar making.

The Shofar makers set up their workshops in camps, museums, schools, Jewish Community Centers, Synagogues, and parks. The workshops are outfitted with many different Shofars from around the world, and mounted heads of horned animals.

The Shofar making demonstration consists of children preparing the unworked ram's horn into a semi-musical horn traditionally used in sounding in the Jewish New Year Rosh Hashana. The children measure, cut, sand and drill these ram horns into kosher shofars. They then learn how to blow the Shofar the way it is blown on Rosh Hashanah like thousands of other Jewish children at this time of year. They are also taught the meaning and significance of the Shofar, its history, shape and sounds. Participants who successfully make a shofar can take it home.

This workshop is part of a series of workshops by Tzivos Hashem. These hands-on Jewish Crafts Workshops help children relate to the holidays on a personal level, giving them a deeper, richer holiday experience. Other workshops in the series include; The Torah Factory before Shavous, Matzoh Bakery before Pesach and the Olive Press before Chanukah.

Tzivos Hashem is an international organization for Jewish children. Tzivos Hashem offers a whole range of programs for Jewish youngsters, including clubs, mitzvah competitions, concerts, rallies, holiday cruises and fairs.

In the former Soviet Union Tzivos Hashem also sponsors medical and humanitarian projects including two orphanages and a medical clinic. Tzivos Hashem created the Jewish Children's Expo in New York's Javits Convention Center and are now creating the world's first Jewish Children's Museum.
